SERIES HISTORY: Penn is 1-0 all-time in its head-to-head series against Marian, winning the only meeting last year 30-15.

Ryan Van Dalen (Jr., Oskaloosa, Oskaloosa HS) had a strong day behind center in last year's matchup, completing 14 of 29 passes for 277 yards and three touchdowns. **Skyler Crouch** (Jr., Payson, Utah, Payson HS) was his favorite target on the day with three receptions for 136 yards (one for 80 yards) and two touchdowns.

Lincoln Cavanagh (Sr., Williams, Northeast Hamilton HS) led the ground attack with 43 yards.

The Statesmen defense forced seven Knight turnovers, including three interceptions by **Jake Jenkins** (Sr., Newton, Northwest Missouri State).

The win gave Penn back-to-back wins to start a season for the first time since 1984.

COACHES: Todd Hafner is in his fifth year as head football coach at Penn, entering the campaign with a 19-25 career record.

Hafner led his 2007 squad to a 5-6 record, including a 3-4 Midwest League mark.

He also guided Penn to the program's first winning season in 29 years in 2005 when it was 6-5. Over his four years, Hafner has produced 44 all-conference players and six All-Americans.

Hafner graduated from Pittsburg State University in 1994 with a degree in mathematics (minor in coaching).

Hafner started his coaching career at Carl Junction HS in Carl Junction, Mo., where he was an assistant football coach for two years. From there he moved on to Southwest Baptist where he was a graduate assistant for one year.

Hafner then returned to Carl Junction to take up the head coaching position. He held it for four years before taking an assistant coaching job at Emporia State in Emporia, Kan. Hafner was the offensive coordinator for two years before adding assistant head coach to his title.

Ted Karras Jr. is in his second season as head coach at Marian and owns a 1-9 career mark entering this year.

Karras came to Marian from Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, where he owned a 14-16 record in three campaigns.

He coached two Academic All-Americans, 13 all-conference players, and the first All-American defensive lineman in school history.

Karras also has a pair of other coaching stints in the MSFA, including at Saint Xavier (offensive coordinator) and at St. Francis (Ill.) (defensive line coach).

He has served as head coach at the prep level as well, heading Adrean HS (Ind.) from 1996-1998 and collecting a 30-10 mark during that span.

A successful player as well, Karras graduated from NCAA Division I Northwestern University and went on to sign with the Washington Redskins for one season.

THE STATESMEN LAST WEEK: Penn rolled to a 41-3 season-opening victory over Waldorf last week.

The new multiple-option offense netted plenty of rushing success as Van Dalen ran the ball 17 times for 145 yards and two touchdowns. **Chris Weigle** (Jr., Meridian, Idaho, Mountain View HS) also ran well with 49 yards and two scores.

The Statesmen defense held the Warriors' option attack to just 148 yards while forcing three turnovers.

THE KNIGHTS LAST WEEK: Marian took it hard on the chin in a 70-7 loss to #5 nationally-ranked Ohio Dominican in Mideast League action.

Quarterback Matt Rogers completed 15 of 31 passes for 195 and Joey Neberieza tallied 46 rushing yards.

JaQuan Patilla was the favorite target of Rogers as he hauled in six passes for 89 yards.

Marian spotted its opponent 42 points before finally getting in the endzone midway through the second quarter on a 25-yard touchdown pass from Rogers to Justin Hall.

THE STATESMEN A YEAR AGO THIS WEEK: Penn was actually outgained in its win over Marian, 392-355, but forced plenty of turnovers to go ahead by as much as 23 points and coast to victory.

The Knights also helped the Statesmen by missing a field goal in the first quarter. Marian moved the ball into Penn territory eight times in the matchup, but came up with just two scores.

THE KNIGHTS A YEAR AGO THIS WEEK: Marian fell to 0-2 on the year in a 39-7 setback to McKendree.

COACH HAFNER SAYS

On the Waldorf game:

"We feel we accomplished pretty much what we set out to do against Waldorf. We executed well on offense and defense and the times that we didn't were minor and we have fixed them."

"We got out of there without getting anyone hurt and had a really good week of practice and feel good about our first week and a half of the season."

On Marian:

"Marian is a very good team, much better than their loss to Ohio Dominican shows. They basically just had one bad quarter against them, but otherwise played very strong against one of the best teams in the nation. They are much more than just a formidable opponent."

"Marian is very balanced on offense, so we will have to pick and choose what we want to attack on defense. Defensively, they blitz from a lot of areas, so we need to make sure we take care of our assignments on offense."

On this week's practice:

"We feel really good about our film study and about how we prepared the guys. We have done about everything we can do, so hopefully it will convert into a great day for us on Saturday."

Quarterback Eldrin Jones was the lone solid performer for the Knights as he completed eight of 15 passes for 87 yards and the only touchdown.

John Pfifer caught that lone touchdown, finishing with three receptions for 29 yards.

Marian was limited to 142 yards of total offense.

STATESMEN TOP OFFENSIVE PLAYERS: Van Dalen was clearly the team's top offensive player after his week one performance against Waldorf. The junior signal-caller finished with 145 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 17 attempts. Weigle rushed for 49 yards and a pair of scores.

Penn passed just six times last week so the receiving stats are not terribly impressive. Crouch leads the squad with one reception for 48 yards.

MARIAN TOP OFFENSIVE PLAYERS: Rogers leads the team with 195 passing yards after the team's first game, while Neberieza has 46 rushing yards.

Patilla is currently the best receiving threat with six receptions for 89 yards.

STATESMEN TOP DEFENSIVE PLAYERS: **Stephen Patterson** (Fr., Detroit, Mich., Highland Park Community HS) leads the Penn defense with nine tackles, while **Travis Grosshans** (Sr., Plattsmouth, Neb., Northwest Missouri State) is next with eight stops.

Terrance Flukers (So., Miami, Fla., Edgewater HS) has the squad's lone interception, while Grosshans and **Brock Peery** (Fr., Payson, Utah, Payson HS) both have one fumble recovery each.

MARIAN TOP DEFENSIVE PLAYERS: Adam Vondersaar and Dustin Craig are tied for the team lead with 11 tackles, while Vondersaar is also tops with two stops for a loss.

STATESMEN TOP SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYERS: **William**

Brasel (Jr., Warrensburg, Mo., Missouri Southern) is currently 5-6 in extra points, while **Michael Harris** (Jr., Panora, Iowa Central CC) has punted seven times for an average of 31.6 yards.

Crouch leads all returners with a 13.0 yard average in punt returns, while **Dexter Shelton** (Fr., West Point, Miss., West Point HS) heads the kickoff return side with one attempt for 30 yards.

MARIAN TOP SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYERS: Bryan Quackenbush has punted six times with an average of 38.5 yards per attempt. He is also 1-1 in extra points.

Ryan Ferguson has returned five kickoffs for an average of 21.8 yards per attempt.
