SERIES HISTORY: Penn is 3-3 all-time in its head-to-head series against Trinity International and has won the past three meetings, including last season's 34-31 overtime victory.

The Statesmen bursted out to a 17-0 lead a year ago, but could not put the Trojans away as Penn actually had to score late in the fourth to force overtime.

In the first overtime, **William Brasel** (Jr., Warrensburg, Mo., Missouri Southern) hit a 44-yard field goal, his second field goal of the day, and then the defense recovered a fumble to secure the win.

Mario Whitney rushed for 146 yards and two touchdowns and **Skylar Crouch** (Jr., Payson, Utah, Payson HS) hauled in two catches for 91 yards, including a game-tying 58-yard score from **Ryan Van Dalen** (Jr., Oskaloosa, Oskaloosa HS).

COACHES: Todd Hafner is in his fifth year as head football coach at Penn, entering the campaign with a 19-25 career record.

Hafner led his 2007 squad to a 5-6 record, including a 3-4 Midwest League mark.

He also guided Penn to the program's first winning season in 29 years in 2005 when it was 6-5. Over his four years, Hafner has produced 44 all-conference players and six All-Americans.

Hafner graduated from Pittsburg State University in 1994 with a degree in mathematics (minor in coaching).

Hafner started his coaching career at Carl Junction HS in Carl Junction, Mo., where he was an assistant football coach for two years. From there he moved on to Southwest Baptist where he was a graduate assistant for one year.

Hafner then returned to Carl Junction to take up the head coaching position. He held it for four years before taking an assistant coaching job at Emporia State in Emporia, Kan. Hafner was the offensive coordinator for two years before adding assistant head coach to his title.

Mike Gims is in his first year as head coach at Trinity International.

THE STATESMEN LAST WEEK: It was a tale of two halves as Penn snuck past Taylor (Ind.) 13-10 in an MSFA crossover game.

Cam Shearon (Fr., St. Peters, Mo., Francis Howell Central HS), in his first collegiate action as placekicker, hit field goals of 46 and 37 yards (game-winner) to lead his team back to the .500 mark.

Lincoln Cavanagh (Sr., Williams, Northeast Hamilton HS) rushed 16 times for 86 yards, while Van Dalen put the ball on the ground 22 times for 72 yards.

Van Dalen also hooked up with **DeMarco Sanders** (Fr., Horn Lake, Miss., Horn Lake HS) for an 18-yard score in the fourth quarter.

THE TROJANS LAST WEEK: Trinity International had little go right last week as it was defeated 56-0 by Saint Xavier (Ill.) in an MSFA crossover matchup.

The Trojans were outgained 521-81 with Jake Moreno having much of the offense, completing eight of 20 passes for 32 yards.

THE STATESMEN A YEAR AGO THIS WEEK: Penn and Trinity International also met in week five of the 2007 season as the Statesmen claimed a 34-31 overtime win.

Although being outgained 396-317, host Penn took advantage of owning the turnover battle. The Statesmen committed just one turnover, while forcing the Trojans into four mistakes, including the game-securing fumble recovery in the first extra session.

THE TROJANS A YEAR AGO THIS WEEK: Kyle Bennett led Trinity International with a decent passing performance in last year's 34-31 loss to Penn.

Bennett completed 16 of 35 passes for 204 yards and three touchdowns, while Derrek Driscoll was a workhorse with 35 rushes for 133 yards. Bennett scored the other Trojan touchdown as well by rushing 42 yards to paydirt in the second quarter.

STATESMEN TOP OFFENSIVE PLAYERS: Van Dalen remains Penn's best offensive threat as he has transformed into a strong multiple-option quarterback.

Through the air, the junior has completed 20 of 50 passes for 385 yards and two touchdowns and has also rushed 71 times for 339 yards (4.8 avg.) and three scores.

Cavanagh, courtesy of a strong showing against Taylor, has also produced in the running attack with 134 yards

COACH HAFNER SAYS

On the Taylor game:

“The fortunate thing for us in that game was that our defense played well in both halves. It was a tribute to our defense to bend and not break when they got into the red zone. Our offense then did a great job wearing down their defense in the second half, which is exactly what it is designed to do.”

On Trinity International:

“They are one of those scary teams. They have played some very good teams early in the year. Even though they haven’t fared very well, they got very good experience.”

“Defensively, they are very fast and fly to the ball and are very aggressive. Offensively, they spread the field and pass to anybody at anytime.”

Sanders has a team-best eight receptions and has both off he squad’s receiving touchdowns (83 yards), but Crouch has been Penn’s biggest threat with 233 yards on just six catches (38.8 avg.).

TRINITY INTERNATIONAL TOP OFFENSIVE PLAYERS:

Moreno and Jordan Peterson have shared time at quarterback with Moreno having a bit more success.

Moreno has completed 36 of 67 passes for 187 yards and a touchdown, while Peterson is 11 of 28 for 79 yards.

Cole Bamberger is the top rushing threat for the Trojans with 43 attempts for 117 yards.

Bamberger has also been the most popular receiving weapon for the team with 15 catches for 48 yards and the lone receiving touchdown. Jacob Love, with nine receptions for 64 yards, heads a trio of players who have seven or more catches as well.

STATESMEN TOP DEFENSIVE PLAYERS: Trevon Green

(Jr., Gaffney, S.C., Gaffney HS) leads Penn with 37 tackles, while **Travis Grosshans** (Sr., Plattsmouth, Neb., Northwest Missouri State) is next with 31 stops.

Terrance Flukers (So., Miami, Fla., Edgewater HS) has a squad-best three interceptions, while five players all have one fumble recovery each.

TRINITY INTERNATIONAL TOP DEFENSIVE PLAYERS:

Tyler Boblit leads the team with 33 tackles, while Brennan Smith is next for TIU with 23 stops.

Smith and Tyler Uhl both have a team-best two interceptions.

STATESMEN TOP SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYERS: Brasel is currently 7-8 in extra points and 0-1 in field goals, while Shearon is 1-1 in extra points and 2-3 in field goals.

Michael Harris (Jr., Panora, Iowa Central CC) has punted 26 times for an average of 32.5 yards.

Crouch leads all returners with a 13.3 yard average over seven punt returns, while Sanders heads the kickoff return side with five attempts for an average of 22.4 yards. **Dexter Shelton** (Fr., West Point, Miss., West Point HS) actually has a better average, however, as he owns a 25.7 yard average over three returns.

TRINITY INTERNATIONAL TOP SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYERS:

Mark Wilcox is 2-2 in extra points and 1-4 in field goal attempts and has also punted 31 times for an average of 37.9 yards.

Smith owns a 21.3 yard average over 13 kickoff returns, while Love has returned two punts for 20 yards.
